Fellow Woodworkers,



Mark Supik


Mark first encountered studio woodturning as an undergraduate at the Maryland Institute College of Art studying sculpture. After graduating, he worked for several woodworking businesses before starting his own shop in one of Baltimore's old industrial neighborhoods. Today, Mark Supik & Co is a family-operated business employing ten woodturners and artistic finishers, that has been turning wood since 1981.

Monday through Friday, Mark directs a staff of woodturners and finishers producing custom architectural millwork, furniture parts, crafted wood products and tap handles for craft brewers. On weekends the shop becomes a woodturning school where Mark teaches classes for hobbyists, tradespeople, artists and crafters. His own turnings of natural edged vessels and sculpted spindle pieces have been displayed in local galleries. 


Volunteer Guild Toy Makers Extraordinaire

Woodworking Classes

Troy Beall's **Annapolis Woodworks** school in Davidsonville will offer the following classes to AWG members this spring/summer. The Guild will provide a subsidy of \$25.00 to each attendee. Each class will need a minimum of 5 students to be held and can accommodate a maximum of 10 students.

Routers 101 class: weekday June 7, weekend May 25

Course Description: Students will learn how to choose the right router and proper bit for the job. Some of the projects to be covered in class will be Dado cuts, mortise and tenons, profiling an edge, pattern cutting, jointing and flattening boards, basic inlays, and much more. All day classes start at 8:30 and run until 5:00pm with a half hour lunch break around noon.

Tuition: \$ 125.00 + \$25.00 materials fee **Cost to you: \$125.00**

Note: The class for June 7th is filled, but the weekend class needs two more to sing up, otherwise it may be cancelled! Fees for this class must be paid to the AWG Treasurer (Vince Antonioli) by 15 May!

Sharpening: weekday July 19, weekend June 22

Course Description: This class is designed to help woodworkers understand the principles of sharpening. With newfound skills, students will be able to sharpen anything. This class requires tools...dull ones that are ready to be sharpened. Sharpening may include turning chisels, bench, mortise, paring chisels, any shape or size carving chisels, plane irons, chain saw blades and hand saws (cross cut or rip). Classes run from 8:30am to 5:00 pm with a half hour lunch break.

Tuition: \$135.00 Materials fee included Cost to you: \$110.00

Note: This is a one-day class for either weekday (July 19) or weekend (June 22) dates. Please pay for this class by 13 June.
